HOW TO GET THERE:-

For those not sure where Diamond Harbour is situated, you'll find it just across the water from the Port of Lyttelton, where it can be reached by either a short launch trip, or a longer drive round the perimeter of the Harbour by car. It is recommended that use be made of the launch especially as they have re-arranged their timetable to suit us and besides, it is a most enjoyable way to cross the water.

Please make sure though that no rubbish is left around the grounds at all, as we have been allowed use of the Domain and surrounds through the generosity of the local organisations, and it is only fair that we leave the grounds in good order.
