# FESTIVAL GUESTS

ALAN YOUNG (Auckland).

Dr Blues has gone electric! - a respected performer and authority on acoustic and electric blues - makes a rare foray to the South Island. The man "The Ferret" is after. Alan's reputation goes before him as New Zealand's leading interpreter of vintage country blues. A past winner of New Zealand's Folk Album of the Year Award with "That's no way to get along". Are we in for a surprise?

BEV YOUNG (Auckland).

One of the finest singers in New Zealand with a widening repertoire of songs both old and new. Bev's interest in folk music started in childhood, with the encouragement of her father, who was born in Durham, England. In the late 1960's she began exploring the British traditional styles that are still the mainstay of her extensive repertoire. The human voice is the original musical instrument, and Bev's forte has always been unaccompanied singing. A fine dulcimer player too!

# FESTIVAL GUESTS

## CANTERBURY BUSH BAND (Canterbury).

A band which traces it's origins back to the 70's - fine musicians in their own right, together they become energetic exponents of the bush band tradition - John and Sue Allan, Peter Morgan and Peter Murray.

## IZZY GARDNER (Scotland/Christchurch) with DAVID ANTHONY.

Singer/guitarist/songwriter joined on guitar by David Anthony. A fine blues singer from a country/blues background - Izzy is a well travelled Scot who has busked her way through Europe, Asia and Australia - now resident in Christchurch. This is her first appearance at a New Zealand festival.

## OWEN HUGH (Scotland).

Fine singer/songwriter from Scotland who has always wanted to be a farmer but discovered wine, woman, song and slow cars. Plays 12 string guitar, nylon string and harmonica. This is his rucksack tour of 1991. Returning from the Gluepot tavern, and Devonport, last seen locally at Whitecliffs festival.

## DAVE MACKAY (Queenstown).

Also known as JHOOF (ex Auckland, Taranaki, Nelson and Queenstown) - this footloose talented comedian will put a smile on your face with his loony antics. During this festival Jhoof will be entertaining both kids and adults.

## MARTINGALE (Canterbury, Dunedin, Palmerston Nth)

Lyn DeGroot (one Bite of the Apple), Tony Hale (High Country Bluegrass) and Howard Edwards (Palmerston North) reforming after 12 years. Martingale has participated in 4 telethons, radio programs and last performed together in 1978 - a once only re-union .. Three part harmonies, country - trad - beatles .. don't miss them!

## TAIN MITCHELL (Scotland/Oxford).

Scottish born, merchant seaman. His strong singing style and infectious humour makes him a memorable performer. Finalist in New Zealand's 1990 Folk Record of the year with "Everyman and His Dog". Mitch has been singing semi-professionally since age 17 - has worked with such artists as Dick Gaughan, The Corries and Matt McGinn. Now based in Oxford, has recently toured with Mike Stanley, Paul Yelder and Davy Stuart.

## DAVY STUART (Scotland/Christchurch).

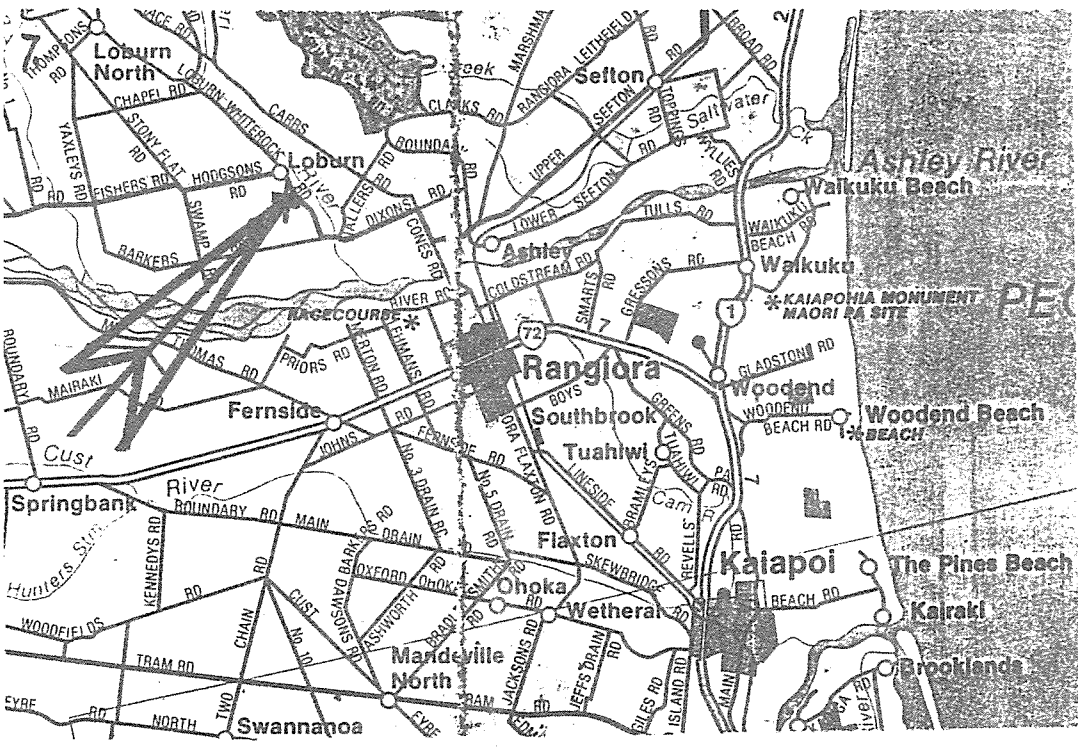
Celtic multi-instrumentalist and instrument maker also from Edinburgh, Scotland. One third of the band Rua (who won the 1990 Folk Record of The Year with "The Commonwealth Suite"), this weekend with Mitch, Paul and Bev. Davy came to N.Z. with the "Rua" tour of 1988-89. He came back to stay mid-1989, and since then has been kept fairly busy with Radio programmes, short tours, and local appearances with "Rua". Previously toured extensively through Europe as part of bands such as Alba, Crannachan and latterly Rua.

## ANDY WHITE (U.K.).

From U.K., via Queenstown - singer/songwriter/virtuoso guitarist with his own unique approach to finger style guitar. He has played support for international acts such as Seals and Crofts, Tom Paxton and John Martyn. A successful recording artist - "Conversations" was the first album by a New Zealand artist to be released on C.D. His latest album "Islands" released in America has reached # 6 on the Billboard New Age charts.

## PAUL YELDER (U.K./Auckland).

Multi-instrumentalist, string player and Irish Piper, combining forces with Bev, Mitch and Davy. Finalist, together with Mitch in the New Zealand Folk Album of the Year with "Everyman and His Dog". Paul became involved in traditional music whilst attending Durham University many moons ago. He has gone from strength to strength since then and has become one of New Zealand's most respected trad musician.
