

WELCOME to ye all, and nice to see you here and all that. This year's Canterbury Folk Festival promises to be very enjoyable with a great line up of guests both local and international. We hope that you all find much to be entertained by amongst the concerts and workshops, but remember that festivals are for everybody so we hope that you'll get involved too - singing or dancing if you feel like it. There will be blackboard concerts and of course it only takes two for a jam!!

ACTIVITIES will take place in marquees 1 and 2 as well as the clubroom and the pavillion. The pavillion also doubles as a Dining room and the Marquees are available at night as sleeping quarters for those who might need them.

CAMPING:  
There is good sheltered area for camping (see map). This camping area will be patrolled regularly to maintain security.

FACILITIES:  
There are plenty of signposted showers and toilets. Hot water is in good supply but if it does run cold it should warm up again quickly.

HOT WATER: for cooking is available from the catering area for those of need of it.

CATERING:  
Is in the trusted hands of Patrick Johnston. He will be creating a range of good low cost meals. There will also be some food of a faster nature available from Laurie Livingstone's caravan beside the main hall.

DRINKIES:  
Bar facilities will operate as usual offering beer and wine. If you're after something stronger you may have to try one of the fine establishments in Amberley township.

THE FOLKSHOP:  
Luckily the folkshop will operate again at Amberley this year offering a variety of records, tapes and books. So, go and see Trevor, he's a good lad.

RUBBISH:

No open fires are allowed on site but primus stoves and cookers are permitted.

-Ask at the information tent.

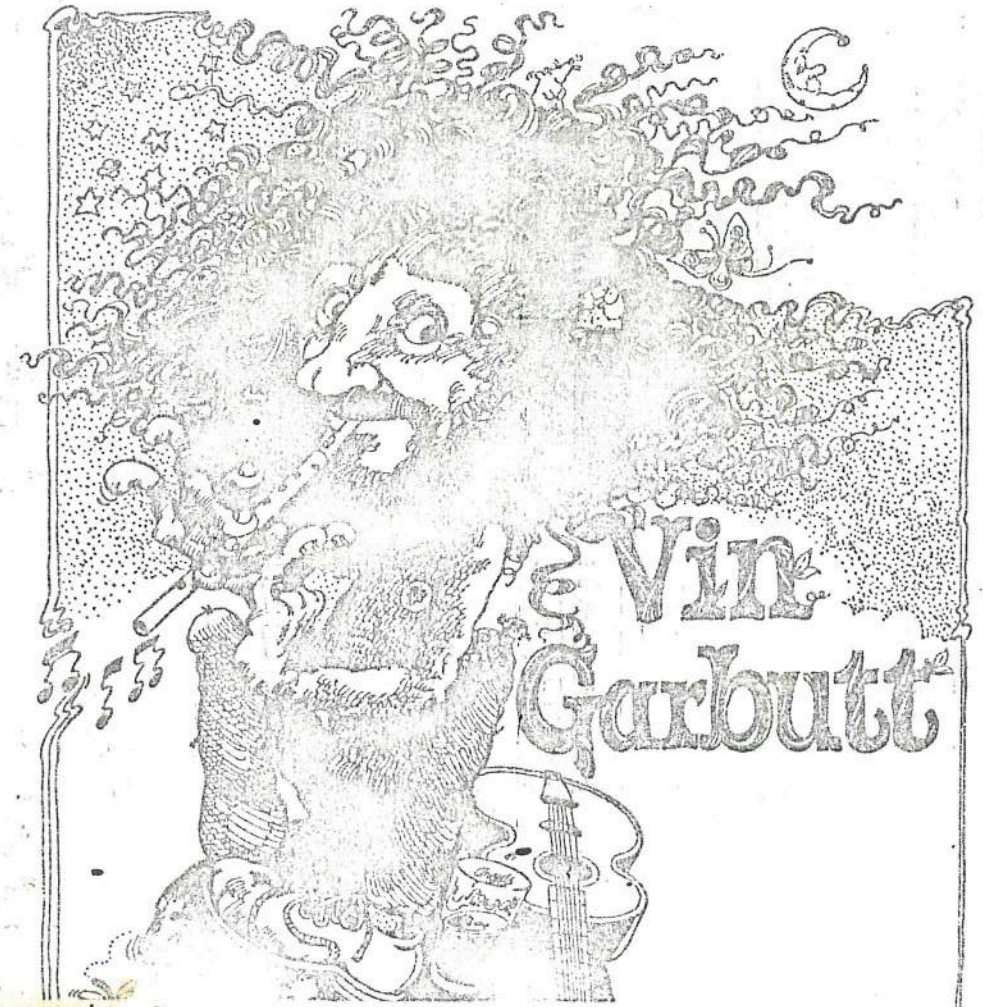
Gill Coe: Is in charge of the instrument safe room. If you want to leave instruments in a safer/cooler place than a tent see Gill.

There will be a limited number of tee-shirts available at a reasonable cost. Check at the information tent.

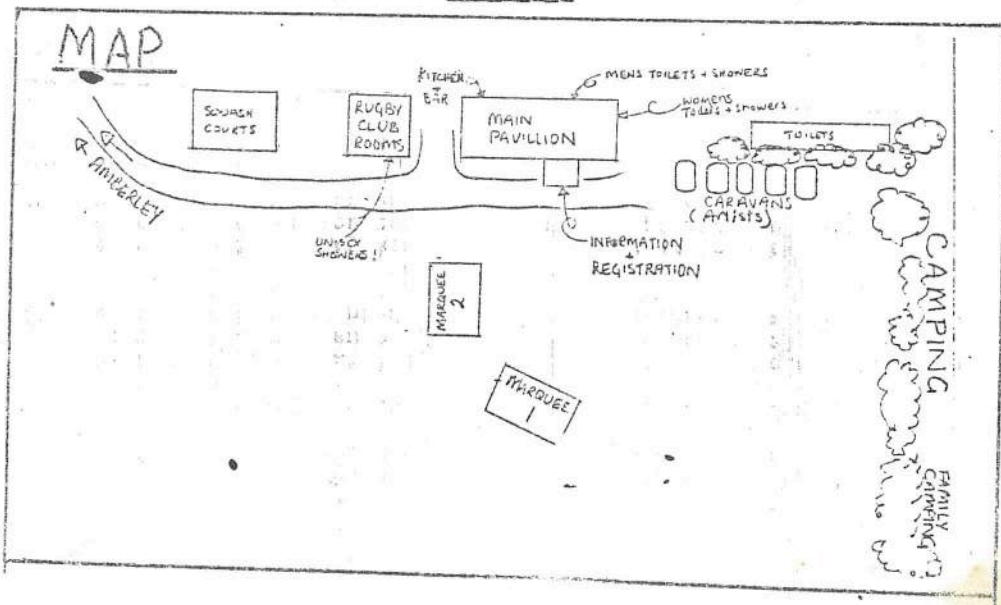
### THE M.V. TUHOE

### VIN GARBUTT:

Itinerant musician from England who sings both traditional and self-penned songs-guitarist and remarkable whistle player. Melody Maker (England) "VIN GARBUTT is a supreme showman, an accomplished musician, an irresistible comedian, an excellent singer. A man worthy of his status as the folk scenes biggest attraction... is nothing short of BRILLIANT!!!"

As well as performing in a mini-concert and Sunday's main concert Vin will provide us with a workshop-"A chance to meet VIN GARBUTT". This will start on Sunday at 12:30 and will not be yet another mini-concert but a chance to find out about Vin's motives and influences in his writing and playing.

### GRAHAM WARDROP:

Christchurch's latest acquisition, an old lad from Dunedin who learned the tricks of the trade with the superstars of Australia. He has emerged as the most exciting VIRTUOSO GUITARIST on the folk scene. Graham's workshop is entitled "harmonics and the use of open strings within scales." A warning - This is a workshop for the more advanced player.

### ROSA SHIELDS:

Now resident in SYDNEY, this ex-Christchurch lady is an accomplished singer of anything from traditional to jazz and beyond. Last year she stunned Christchurch audiences with her talent and enthusiasm. We are not sure what Rosa's workshop is called but we are sure that it will be summat effnik.

### JO AND JUDE:

Unaccompanied traditional folk duo from Invercargill, they will be participating in their own inimitable style in Sunday morning's "WOMENFOLK" mini-concert and the main concert on Sunday. A welcome return to the folk scene North of Invercargill.

### PAUL YIELDER:

Player of the pipes and holder of Geordie accent. This ex-member of "DALRIADA" will conduct a workshop "Techniques, to be sure, with Irish piping" on Sunday at 5:30.

### ST. ALBANS SUNSHINE SERENADERS:

Swing/Jazz from Tim Barrie and friends - the "in crowd" from one of Christchurch's posher suburbs!!

### BUSHFIRE:

Our real New Zealand band and defenders of the folk, our Saturday night barn dance just wouldn't be complete without them. They will also be our hosts at Monday's pub session at Warners Tavern.

### BARRIE McDONALD:

Star of the Auckland Folk Festival and also plays a mean jig. Barrie will present two workshops as well as performing with "GAEL FORCE"-Bob Bickerton, Dave Kidd and Barrie -The first is a Do it yourself tune session where everyone and their instrument is invited to learn a new tune under Barrie's guidance and tuition. The second workshop is a chance to draw all these musicians and others together at tea time on Sunday with Barrie as the Umpire. Sort of organised chaos.

### GARY GRACE & RICHARD BUDD:

A new all male duo singing new and old ( and original) New Zealand songs, not to be missed.

PACHAMAMA:

Authentic Latin-American music right from the heart of Christchurch, but don't be fooled. These musicians draw on the finest of South American tradition and culture and their workshop "Andes music - an introduction" is a chance to play along with them and to get your hands on some traditional South American instruments.

MIKE WARNEY:

Yet another great singer/guitarist from the ranks of the New Edinburgh folk club, Dunedin. On Saturday at 11:30 in the clubroom we try something new in the way of a "Songwriting workshop" where, with Mike's help you can compose your own songs - This is a real workshop!

MARK APPERLEY:

Mark will play as part of "Gannon" a group which perform mainly Irish music but with a hint of all sorts of other styles. The group comprises of Hillary Critchley, Allen Hogan and Mark.

KE CONCEPTIONS:

A Christchurch duo providing musical satire (Humour, harassment and H-bombs.) They will perform on Friday night and as part of the "womenfolk" workshop on Sunday morning.

JOHN STAFFORD:

Another well informed (dare I say it ?) folklorist and performer from Blenheim. "Give it heaps - a history of British traditional electric folk song" is the almost self explanatory title to John's workshop. (Anything could happen!)
